Guidelines for guests doing ANY Scuba training.

All medications and conditions MUST be declared as only a <u>Doctor of</u>
 <u>Barometric Medicine</u> can declare them safe for use while diving. This will
 prevent unnecessary delays before diving can commence while on
 island.

A Doctor of Barometric Medicine will be available in your area and can be located by calling Divers Alert Network at 1-919-684-2948

Guests must complete the medical questionnaire Appendix F.
Any YES answer will require a doctors clearance.

Failure to declare a medical condition could result in injury or death.

- Resort Course: This is for Uncertified divers and entails a short theory and pool session in the morning and a shallow dive in the afternoon.
- <u>Refresher:</u> All divers who have not dived for more than 2 years need to do a refresher.
 - This entails a pool session with an instructor to complete a skills circuit.
- <u>Scuba Review:</u> All divers who have not dived in more than 7 years need to do a scuba review. This entails completing a short workbook and quiz as well as a pool session skills circuit review.
- Open Water Referral: All referral candidates must bring the referral documents from the referring instructor. Failure to do so will delay the course while they are sourced.
- <u>Full Open Water Students:</u> Course takes 4 days to complete and involves 5 theory sessions, 5 pool sessions, a written exam and 4 open water check out dives.

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
